#### 1. PRESENTATION OF THE ASSOCIATION


Fert is a French agri-agency for international cooperation in agricultural development in developing and emerging countries.

For over 30 years, it has been supported by French grain organizations, especially Unigrains.

Its objective is to enable farmers to improve their living and working conditions and to ensure food security in their countries.

Fert supports farmers in creating organizations (producer groups, cooperatives, agricultural credit unions, training centers, etc.) that allow them to provide sustainable solutions to the challenges they face in their profession and the defense of their interests.

In 11 countries, Fert carries out around twenty field actions, mobilizing agricultural professionals and technicians in a spirit of solidarity to share their experience in professional commitment and organizational management.



#### 2. MISSION

Fert has set itself the mission of contributing to the improvement of agricultural economies in developing or emerging countries

Its approach is based on three key considerations:

- The agricultural economy of a country fundamentally relies on farmers. They
  have the vocation to feed their country, and to do so, they must be able to
  make a living from their profession.
- The farmer is a responsible entrepreneur capable of independently making numerous decisions based on their own objectives and constraints. They should be considered and respected as such.
- Each farmer has limited individual power. It is through coming together in suitable organizations that farmers can:
  - Find common solutions to common problems and manage the implementation of these solutions,
  - Influence the technical, economic, and political environment through participation or negotiation to defend common interests.

Fert supports the creation or development of producer organizations with a strong conviction that such organizations can only emerge and consolidate through ongoing interaction between concrete achievements providing sustainable services to their members (technical, commercial, financial actions, etc.) and the associative mobilization of these members.

# To achieve this, Fert commits to acting with long-term dedication and continuity.

Fert serves as an interface between field action and the full range of professional expertise that needs to be mobilized according to expressed needs. It aims to make available to farmers in developing countries the know-how acquired over more than sixty years of experience in organizing producers in technical, economic, commercial, and financial domains. To do so, it draws on the collective expertise of French agricultural professional organizations.

Its approach is founded on three principles drawn from the farming experience: rigor, pragmatism, and solidarity.


This translates to nearly **76 900** beneficiary families of the actions undertaken in 2022.
